Sherry Corbett also made a suggestion to publish member's favorite recipes "that are easy, and quite portable for those sailboat raft-ups!!!" NO Problem Sherry!.....published below are two of Sherry's favorites to start, if you do have any questions of Sherry, her email is [scorbett@gwattorneys.com](mailto:scorbett@gwattorneys.com) Hopefully, we'll receive lots of input from the membership to have a recurring "**Recipes for Raft-Ups**" column.

#### **Shrimp Ceviche**

1 lb. cooked shrimp (any size), shelled and chopped  
1 cup lime juice  
1/2 cup Kraft Zesty Italian dressing  
1 red pepper, seeded, chopped  
1 celery stalk, chopped  
1 Tbsp. chopped cilantro

Combine all ingredients, cover, refrigerate several hours to marinate.  
Prior to packing the picnic basket, drain the shrimp mixture, discarding the marinade.  
Serve with tortilla chips on the boat with a cold Corona nearby!!!

#### **Spicy Pimento Cheese**

8 oz. sharp yellow cheddar cheese, grated\*  
8 oz. sharp white cheddar cheese, grated\*  
1/2 cup mayonnaise  
4 oz. jar chopped pimentos, drained, chopped finely  
1/2 tsp. sugar  
1/4 tsp pepper  
3 Tbsp Picante Sauce or Salsa (mild or hot, your choice)  
2 Tbsp. chopped parsley

Combine all ingredients. Garnish with sliced green onions (opt.).  
Serve with crackers, celery, or melted on top of burgers or steaks....  
(\*Note: Any 16 oz. of grated cheeses work...I've tried the Mexican Blend bag of grated cheese in place of the white cheddar, and it was delicious!)

In the last OYC news letter, I listed a couple of sites that specialized in nautical consignment items. One more recommendation is located in St. Augustine, FL. Known as the “**The Sailor’s Exchange**,” it’s located on 224-226 West King Street. Hours are Tue-Fri:9-5; Sat 9-2; Sun-Mon Closed. If you’re down that way it’s worth a side trip to check out their large inventories of nautical goodies.

I’m pretty sure I spend more time maintaining my boats than sailing them. Two sources that I have come to rely on are:

1. “**The Complete Illustrated Sailboat Maintenance Manuel**” by Don Casey, published by McGraw-Hill. I know it’s steep at \$59.95, but well worth the price since it covers everything you need to know about sail boat repairs.

2. Another great publication that I have found priceless is my subscription to “**BoatWorks**” a quarterly magazine put out by the same folks who publish “Sail” magazine. (see [boatworksmagazine.com](http://boatworksmagazine.com)) BoatWorks covers a myriad of projects such as installing a wheel, bottom and topside painting, installing auto-helms, the list is endless. What makes BoatWorks stand out is that the articles are written for people with no prior experience. Find a copy at West Marine, after your initial perusal send in your subscription for cheaper rates.

If you’re still looking for answers to fix your problems and don’t want to spend any money....check out [www.bosunsupplies.com/knowledge.cfm](http://www.bosunsupplies.com/knowledge.cfm) there are a number of maintenance subjects covered.

Ok, not only does the boat need maintenance, but the skipper can always use some upkeep. Check out [www.boatingbasicsonline.com](http://www.boatingbasicsonline.com) . It’s a quiz on your basic boating knowledge, covering rules of the road, navigation, safety requirements.....Go ahead take the test and see what you forgot.

One last hint, that many boat owners are still not sure about is the data contained in a hull number. Check out [www.nw.org/hull\\_numbers.htm](http://www.nw.org/hull_numbers.htm) for a detailed explanation.

**Extended Wednesday Night Series** – A proposal has been submitted to the Lake Norman Yacht Club to sponsor a Fall Series WNS which will consist of six races starting September 5 and ending October 10. These include lowering the minimum boat entry length to 15 feet, which is designed to open it up to more sailors such as the M-C Scow fleet.
